



On November 3, 2026, voters in Tazewell County will decide on a proposed 1% County Schools Facility Tax (commonly known as a One-Cent Tax) to fund facility and safety needs in our public schools.

School districts in Tazewell County have united to bring forward this question to voters.

HOW WOULD FUNDS BE USED?

By law, the revenue generated by this One-Cent Tax may only be used for:

Facility Improvements

Critical repairs to roofs, HVAC systems, restrooms, and parking lots, additions and renovations, durable equipment, demolition, land acquisition, and architectural planning.

School Safety and Support

Surveillance systems, secure entryways, fire prevention, life safety, **School Resource Officers** and **Mental Health Providers**.

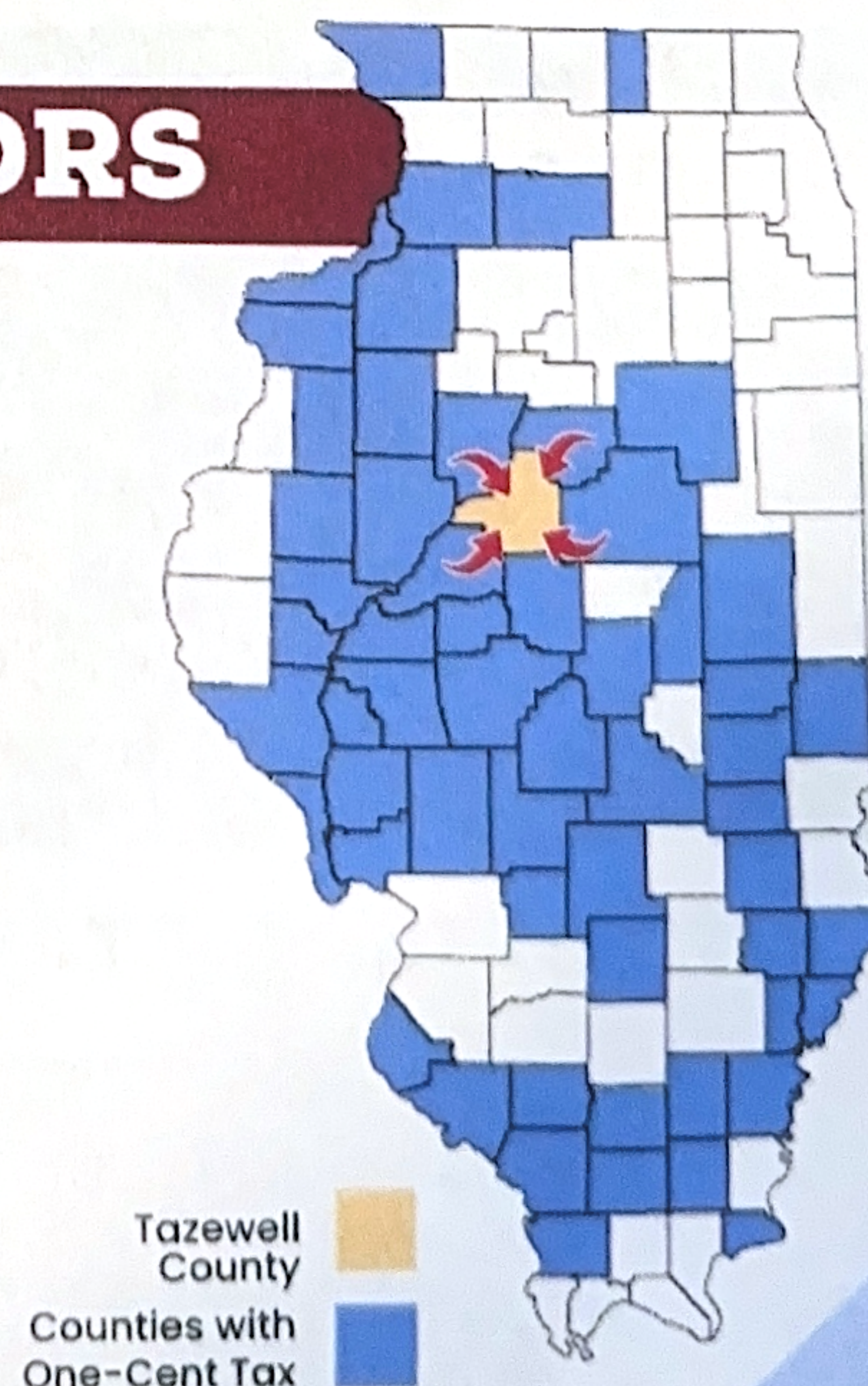

Ease Reliance on Property Taxes:

Unlike property taxes, a One-Cent Tax is collected from **both** county residents and visitors. People that commute, shop, or dine in Tazewell County would help provide an alternative funding source for schools, **reducing the financial burden on property tax payers** while ensuring essential improvements and services are funded.

Every county that borders Tazewell County has a sales tax in place to support their local schools, including McLean, Peoria, Fulton, Logan, Woodford, and Mason.

ITEMS **NOT** TAXED UNDER THIS PROPOSAL

- Groceries
- Prescription medications
- Vehicles (cars, trucks, boats)
- Farm equipment
- Personal/professional services (haircut, accounting, legal, etc.)
- Wholesale purchases



The One-Cent Tax applies only to purchases currently subject to Illinois sales tax.

HOW WOULD FUNDS BE DISTRIBUTED TO SCHOOLS?

If approved, Tazewell County would maintain **local control** over these funds.

School districts would receive funding based on the number of students enrolled in each school, and each district would decide how funds are allocated based on Illinois law.

WHAT WOULD THIS COST?

A family of four in the Peoria region spends an estimated average of \$17,572 per year on qualifying purchases, according to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

That means this One-Cent Tax would add:

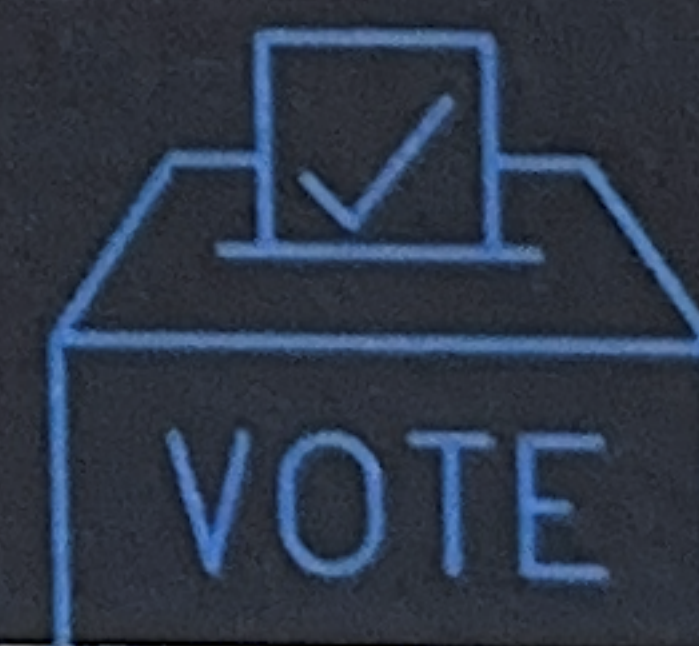
